# MODIFYING CHAPTER 43 OF THE VILLAGE CODE "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO PROHIBIT PARKING COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS

The proposed local law finds and determines that parking commercial vehicles on Village streets in residential neighborhoods undermines the residential character of the Village, obstructs sightline and is a danger to residents, especially children.

Resident Hugh McKay, 47 James Road, supports this local law as there are many parked work vehicles on the road creating safety issues.

Trustee Karl confirmed that this proposed local law prohibited parking commercial vehicles on the street, not driveways. One commercial vehicle is allowed to be parked in the driveway only.

### **HALLOWEEN CURFEW 2022:**

WHEREAS, on October 29th, October 30th and October 31st (Halloween) the Village is besieged by youths who create problems for residents, and the Monroe Police Department. To complicate the situation, the Police Department has determined that many of the youth were non-residents who refuse to leave the Village due to the fact that there were no laws requiring them to be off the streets; and

WHEREAS, the following definitions shall apply: MINOR - being less than eighteen (18) years old PARENT - the natural or adoptive parent of a minor GUARDIAN - any person other than a parent who has legal guardianship of a minor CUSTODIAN – any person over the age of twenty-one (21) who is Loco Parentis to a minor PUBLIC PLACE – any street, alley, highway, sidewalk, park, playground or place which the general public has access and a right to resort for business, entertainment or other lawful purpose. A "public place" shall include but is not limited to any store, shop, restaurant, tavern, bowling alley, café, theater, drugstore, pool room, shopping center and any other place devoted to amusement or open to the general public. It shall also include the front or immediate area of the above, and

WHEREAS, any minor attending a special function or entertainment of any church, school, club or organization that requires such minor to be out at a later hour than called for within this Proclamation shall be exempt from the provisions of the Proclamation, provided such church, school, club or other similar organization shall register in advance with the Monroe Police Department to have the minors stay out to this later hour. The registrant shall state the time, when the function or entertainment shall end, and the minors who attend the function shall be required to be in their places of abode within one-half hour after the function is ended; and

WHEREAS, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation operating or having charge of any public place to knowingly permit or suffer the presence of minors under the age of 18 on October 29th, 30th and 31st between the hours of 8 PM and 6 AM the following morning; and

WHEREAS, it shall be unlawful for the parent, guardian or other adult person having custody or control of any minor under the age of 18 to permit or, by inefficient control, to allow such minor to be on the streets or sidewalk or on or in any public property or public place within the Village on October 29th, 30th and 31st between the hours of 8 PM and 6 AM the following morning. However, the provisions of this section do not apply to a minor accompanied by his parent, guardian, custodian or other adult person having the care, custody or control of the minor or if the minor is on an emergency errand or specified business or activity directed by his parent, guardian, custodian or other adult having the care or custody of the minor, or if the parent, guardian, custodian or other adult person herein has made a missing person notification to the Village Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, during the period October 29th, 30th and 31st it shall be unlawful for any minor to remain idle, wander, stroll, or play in any public place, either on foot or to cruise about without a set destination in any vehicle, in, about or upon any place in the Village between the hours of 8 PM and 6 AM of the following morning unless accompanied by a parent, guardian, custodian or other adult person having custody or control of such minor, or unless the minor is an emergency errand or specified business or activity or permitted by his parent, guardian or other adult person having the custody and care of the minor or where the presence of such minors connect with or required by some legitimate employment, trade, profession or occupation. Any police officer upon finding a minor in violation of this Resolution shall ascertain the name and address of the minor and warn the minor that he/she is in violation of curfew and shall direct the minor to proceed at once to his or her home or usual place of abode. The police officer shall report such action to the parents, guardian or person having custody or control of the minor. If such minor refuses to heed the warning or direction given by any police officer or refuses to give the police officer his/her correct name and address or if the minor has been warned on a previous occasion that he or she was in violation of curfew, such minor, if age 16 years or older, may be issued an appearance ticket, and the parent, guardian or other adult having the care and custody of such minor shall be notified to appear with such minor at a date and time to be determined in the appearance ticket for an appearance before the Village of Monroe Justice Court. Any minor age 16 years or older who violates any section of this article shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine not to exceed \$100 for a first offense and not to exceed \$250 for each additional offense. Community service may be imposed by the court in addition to the above minimum fine. When a minor is required to perform community service, the parent or guardian shall be required to transport the minor to the place(s) specified by the court.

The Board of Trustees directed the property owner of 13 Lakes Road (212-2-2), 13 Lakes Road, LLC to take immediate and appropriate action to correct, repair, restore and or replace with in-kind all material, structural components, assemblies and or conditions, which appear or known to be unsafe, unsound, inadequate to support required loads, provide weather protection, and or otherwise required to achieve the necessary safeguards, in order to maintain full compliance with New York State Property Maintenance (NYSPM) Code requirements for all structures and accessory structures on the premises. The owner

shall consult with the Building Department for Building Permit requirements, as may be necessary for any and all related work at the premises.

The Board of Trustees requested this property to comply by August 31, 2022:

\*Remove the unsafe front porch.

\*Secure the remainder of the building from entry including repairing the hole in the right rear corner of the roof.

Inspector Cocks inspected the building at 13 Lakes Road in reference to the violation that was presented to the Village Board. The roof was patched to prevent water infiltration and the building was secured, but they failed to remove the collapsing front porch as they have been directed in the resolution from the previous Board meeting.

RESOLVED, the Board of Trustees hereby declares that the Village of Monroe shall cause the property maintenance violations to be remedied and such actual costs shall be charged and assessed, along with such administrative fees applicable to said violations, and unpaid sums shall constitute a lien and charge on the real property and shall be assessed against such property and collected in the same manner as real property taxes.

# ADOPTION – LOCAL LAW #8 OF 2022 – MODIFYING CHAPTER 43 OF THE VILLAGE CODE "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO PROHIBIT COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS:

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Monroe, New York ("Village Board") duly noticed a public hearing held on September 6, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board solicited public comment during said public hearing on September 6, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local law finds and determines that parking commercial vehicles on Village streets in residential neighborhoods undermines the residential character of the Village, obstructs sightline and is a danger to residents, especially children.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

- 1. The above "WHEREAS" paragraphs are incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The Local Law Modifying Chapter 43 of the Village Code "Vehicles and Traffic" to Prohibit Parking Commercial Motor Vehicles in Residential Districts as attached is adopted as Local Law No. 8 of 2022 of the Village of Monroe on September 6, 2022.
- 3. The Village Board hereby directs the Village Clerk to take all steps to process and file said Local Law.
  - 4. This Local Law shall be effective immediately.

# VILLAGE OF MONROE INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW

MODIFYING CHAPTER 43 OF THE VILLAGE CODE "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO PROHIBIT PARKING COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Monroe, County of Orange, State of New York, as follows:

### **Section 1.** Legislative Findings, Purpose and intent.

The Village Board of Trustees finds and determines that parking commercial vehicles on Village streets in residential neighborhoods undermines the residential character of the Village, obstructs sightline and is a danger to residents, especially children.

### **Section 2.** Authority.

This local law is enacted by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Monroe pursuant to its authority to adopt local laws pursuant to the New York State Constitution and Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and Article 14-B of the General Municipal Law.

**Section 3.** Section 43-5, "Reserved," of Chapter 43, titled, "Vehicles and Traffic," of the Code of the Village of Monroe is hereby amended as follows:

#### § 43-5. Commercial motor vehicles prohibited parking.

- A. Definition of commercial motor vehicle. For the purpose of this Chapter, a commercial motor vehicle is any vehicle used to transport goods or passengers including, but not limited to, trucks, box trucks, recreational vehicles, buses, vans, taxis and so forth, with a gross vehicle weight of 8,500 pounds or greater or a gross vehicle weight of less than 8,500 pounds for which the operator must have a commercial driver's license issued by the State of New York.
- B. Parking prohibited in residential districts. Commercial vehicles shall be prohibited from parking on Village streets in all residential districts.
- C. Enforcement. This section shall be enforced by the Village of Monroe Police Department's parking enforcement officer or officers or such other officer as designated by the Chief of Police.
- D. Each violation of this section shall be punishable by a fine of \$100 and shall be subject to removal and storage as set forth in § 43-42A(3) and § 43-42B.

**Section 4.** Supersession, of Inconsistent Laws, if any.

The Village Board of Trustees hereby declares its legislative intent to supersede any provision of any local law, rule, or regulation and any provision of the state Village Law or other special law that may be declared inconsistent or in conflict with this local law. The courts are specifically requested to take notice of this legislative intent and apply such intent in the event the Village has failed to specify any provision of law that may require supersession. The Village Board hereby declares that it would have enacted this local law and superseded such provision had it been apparent.

### **Section 5.** Severability.

If any section, part or provision of this local law or the application thereof to any person, property or circumstance is adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, part, provision or application directly and expressly adjudged invalid and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this local law or the application thereof,

#### **Section 6.** Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Hugh McKay, resident, was enlightened to see what's happening in the Village and thanked the Board. He was pleased by the ordinance for no parking of commercial vehicles in residential districts, as it helps maintain the character of the neighborhood. He expressed concerns of multiple families living together in small homes. He feels it is a safety hazard. Property owners need to take accountability for who is renting their properties. Mr. McKay also complimented Inspector Cocks on his professionalism.

Wayne Chan, resident, thanked Trustee Karl for his work on the village of Monroe Water Source Protection Plan. He inquired about a water capacity study. Mayor Dwyer said we are currently working on that. Mr. Chan also commented that he saw the Village watering flowers in the Village and expressed concerns over this since we have mandatory water restrictions. Mayor Dwyer explained that as of now our main concern was lawn irrigation, not watering specialty plantings and flowers.
