MAYOR & TRUSTEE REPORT:

Trustee Karl asked for an update on the Pond Dredging Project. Mayor Dwyer explained that there had been a revision to the scope of work from the first bidder. The second lowest bidder has presented a plan using sock technology, having one set up on each pond. Village events would still be in place as there would be no loss of access to the park. Trustee Karl inquired as to if draining the pond and just cleaning it up has been discussed. Trustee Karl also confirmed that the grant from Senator Skoufis in the amount of \$565,000.00 is still good towards the pond dredging.

Trustee Karl has noticed bulk items throughout the Village have been out for several weeks without being picked up from Marangi. This needs to be addressed as it doesn't look good. He also has concerns over the tonnage limit in the agreement mentioned in the constant contact sent out by the Town of Monroe. Mayor Dwyer and Trustee Karl agree that rental homes should be charged a commercial rate for garbage pick-up. Mayor Dwyer said a meeting has been set with Marangi for next week.

Trustee Karl expressed concerns for properties in the Village with multiple cars parked in front yards. He suggested looking at water meter readings and compare the water usage to the average American Water Works Association (AWWA) suggested figures per members in the household to see if water is being used in excess to help determine how many people are living in the household.
